

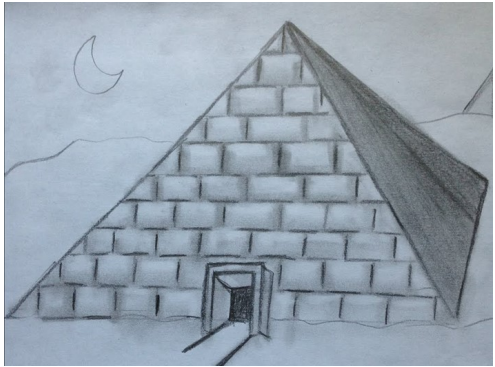


Line drawing: Egyptian pyramids (Imhotep)

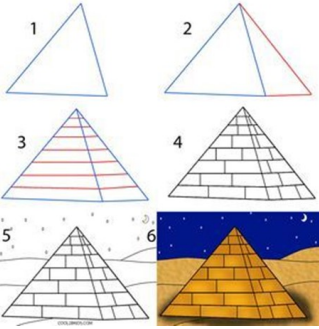

- Key knowledge:**
- Sketching pencils are medium of choice to explore shading and toning.
 - The sketching pencils are easy to smudge and blend and are ideal for a wide range of shading techniques.
 - Using different media achieves variations in line, texture, tone, colour, shape and pattern.
 - Imhotep is an Egyptian Architect who probably designed the step pyramids.
 - An architect is a person who designs buildings

We are learning to create a pyramid landscape with media of choice using more accurate shades and tones.

What have we learnt already?

In Year 1, you used different materials such as pencils, oil pastels to make marks using lines and curves. You experimented with thickness of lines.

Key vocabulary

Tone	How light or dark a colour is.
Shading	Darkening or colouring an image to create shadows and a 3D effect.
Pressure	How hard you press the pencil down to make a mark
Media	Media is described as the material used to create art. E.g. charcoal, paint, etc.
Architect	A person who designs buildings
Shadow effects	Drawing how the shadow would look
Line drawing	A drawing done using only narrow lines.
