Key Knowledge:

To add tone, you can use different amounts of pressure to get a darker/lighter colour.

To add texture to my drawing you can use lines - hatching, cross hatching, contour hatching, stippling and blending.

Certain mediums are easy to smudge and blend and are ideal for a wide range of shading techniques.

I can use my medium to create a mood, and add detail.

Key vocabulary

silhouette	the shape or outline of something; especially : the outline of an object seen or as if seen against the light.
prehistoric	relating to or denoting the period before written records.
mood	Often when an <i>artist</i> uses colour in a <i>painting</i> they are trying to communicate an <i>emotion, mood</i> or atmosphere.
blending	Blending is the process of fusing two colors together so that the paint transitions from one color to another, or combines to create a new color.
texture	Texture in art concerns the surface quality of a piece of work . In three-dimensional artwork, the term refers to how the piece feels when it's touched.
