## Key Knowledge

There is a network of Computers that use the internet and as a result, if your content is public anybody can see it. This could be someone in another country or school to you. When you post information online, it is important to remember that anybody could see it and take careful steps to protect yourself.

## Tips for Staying Safe Online

1. Don't share your personal information with others.
2. Use safe **websites** that a trusted adult has checked first.
3. Limit the amount of time you spend **online**.
4. Not everything you see **online** is true. Only trust information from a reliable source.
5. Tell a trusted adult if something **online** makes you upset or uncomfortable.
6. Only download or purchase something if a trusted adult has given you permission first.

## Key Vocabulary

<b>cyberbullying</b>	Any form of bullying that takes place <b>online</b> and causes harm or distress to a person or group of people.
<b>Internet</b>	A large network of computers connected to each other all around the world.
<b>online</b>	When a user, computer or another PC device connects to the <b>Internet</b> , it is <b>online</b> .
<b>personal information</b>	This is information about yourself that can be used to identify you.
<b>search engine</b>	A service you use on the <b>Internet</b> to help you find information via the World Wide Web.
<b>website</b>	A collection of web pages grouped together.

## How to Create a Secure Password

- Include numbers, letters and symbols. 
- Never use obvious names or dates. 
- Make it something that you will remember but others cannot guess.

**Top Tip:** Keep your password safe. Don't share it with others.
