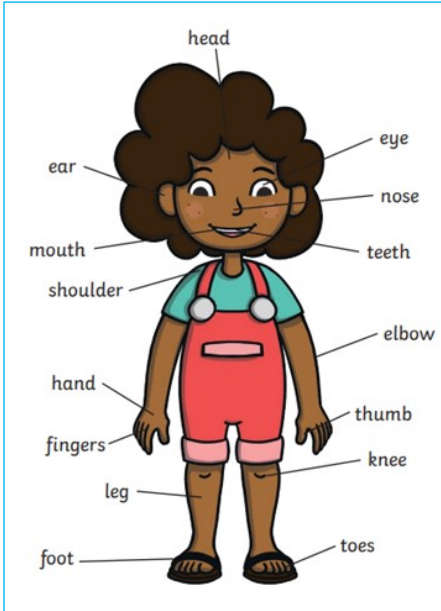


# Animals, including Humans—Year 1

We use our mouths to taste.



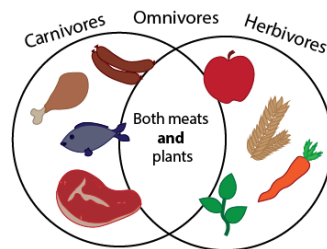
We use our ears to hear.



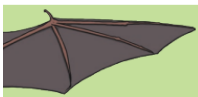
We use our noses to smell.

Carnivores eat meat. Herbivores eat plants. Omnivores eat both meat and plants.

Animals have different skin coverings, such as scales, fur and feathers.

animal	It is a living thing.
carnivore	Animals that mostly eat other animals.
herbivore	Animals that eat only plants.
omnivore	Animals that eat both plants and other animals.
