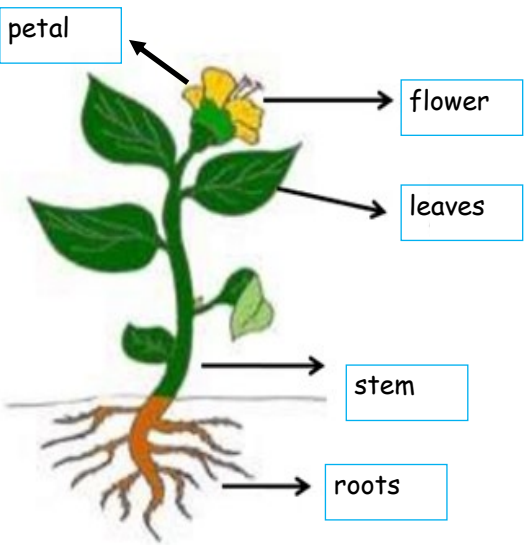


Plants –Year 1

Previous learning:
 You will have looked at different plants that grow outside and begin to name some of them in EYFS. You explored the changes that take place to plants and trees throughout the seasons. You learnt that some foods can come from plants.

Weeds are plants that grow in places where people do not want them.



Garden plants are the ones people have planted in their gardens.

Wild plants grow where the seed has fallen.

| Key vocabulary | Definitions |
|----------------|---|
| plant | A living thing that usually grows from the ground. |
| seed | The part of a plant that can grow a new plant. |
| leaf | The part of the plant or tree that are flat, thin and usually green. |
| stem | The thin, upright part of a plant on which the flowers and leaves grow. |
| root | The part of the plant that grows underground. |
| petal | It is the colourful part of the plant. |
| fruit | It contains the plant's seeds. |
| evergreen | A tree that has leaves all year round. |
| deciduous | A tree that loses its leaves in the autumn every year. |



Evergreen trees have leaves all year round. The leaves are thick, waxy and narrow.



Deciduous trees lose their leaves in the autumn. The leaves are broad and flat.

Future learning:
 In Year 2, you will look at how seeds and bulbs grow into mature plants. You will focus on what plants need to grow healthily, such as water, light and a suitable temperature.
