

# OUR TRUST

Our COO, Melanie Bark, has been working brilliantly with all the contactors and we will take possession of the building in July 2025.




## Stanhope Primary School

## How the EEEA continues to develop our school estates

As a Trust we are able to bid for funds to improve our school environments. The funding for this is called Condition Improvement Funds (CIF).

Each year it is becoming harder to secure CIF funds but at EEEA we have an excellent track record of improving our estates for the children and staff.

**We have secured over £9 million in funding which we would not have accessed if we were not a Trust!**
