Keeping Your Child Safe Online



Parental Advice: Supporting Safe YouTube Use

YouTube is a popular platform among children (recommended 13+), offering educational videos, cartoons, and DIY content. While it can be a great resource, it's important to help children use it safely. Here are some tips for parents:

1. **Use YouTube Kids:** This app filters content to make it more appropriate for children. However, it's not perfect, so supervision is still important.
1. **Set Time Limits:** Encourage balanced screen time by setting daily or weekly limits. This helps prevent overuse and ensures children engage in other activities.
1. **Watch Together:** Viewing videos with your child allows you to discuss what they're watching and address any questions or concerns.
1. **Discuss Online Safety:** Remind children not to share personal information online and to speak to you if they see anything upsetting or confusing.
1. **Use Playlists and Subscriptions:** Curate safe and educational content by subscribing to trusted channels or creating playlists for your child.

Here's a set of sentence starters that you can use to spark conversation about what your child is watching on YouTube:

Talking About YouTube

1. "What do you like about this video?"
1. "Can you tell me what's happening in the story/video?"
1. "How does this video make you feel?"
1. "Why do you think the character/person did that?"
1. "Is there anything in this video that confuses you?"
1. "Do you think this could happen in real life?"
1. "What did you learn from this video?"
1. "Would you watch this again? Why or why not?"
1. "Do you think the information in this video is true?"
1. "How would you explain this video to a friend?"

Nurture Principles—All Behaviour is Communication

We have linked the Nurture Principles and our 5 Learning Behaviours together to support the children with their well-being and learning.

This half-term we are focusing on being resilient and knowing that our behaviour tells us how we are feeling. In school, the children use Zones of Regulation resources and our bubble system to help.

Both in school and at home, adults should be aware that all behaviour is a child's way of telling us something and therefore we need to reflect on the reasons behind their behaviour.

- Why are they behaving in this way?
- What are they trying to tell us?
- What can we do to help them?

Some behaviours to look for are being withdrawn, quick to anger, being tearful—it is really any behaviour that is not usual for each child. At home and at school, adults can have conversations with the children to work together to find what helps them the best.

Resilient Ronald - Autumn 1



Behaviour
All behaviour is communication

- Meet Resilient Ronald! After being zapped with a resilience ray gun, Ronald is able to empower children with his bounce back ability power. Children look to him for help when there are distractions in the room or they are feeling like giving up on their task. Ronald assists by reminding children to manage their distractions and to never give up.
- Resilient Ronald reminds us that our behaviour can tell us that we are finding something hard, that we may need to talk to an adult to help us.

Travelling To and From School:

A Reminder for Year 5 & 6 Parents & Carers.

We would like to take this opportunity to remind you of our 'Travelling to and from School' policy, which outlines our expectations for safe and independent travel for all children and their families.

As children move into **Year 5**, it becomes the expected **practice** that they begin to travel to and from school more independently. This means that we will assume your child may arrive at school on their own in the mornings and leave independently at the end of the day when released by the adult in charge of their class, unless we are informed otherwise in writing. This marks a change from earlier school years (Years R-4), where a responsible adult is expected to collect each child.

As stated in our policy:

Children in Years 5 and 6 are generally expected to travel to and from school independently, unless parents/carers have notified the school in writing that they will continue to collect their child.

As it states in our policy:

- Children in Yr R, Yr 1 and Yr 2 should be dropped off and collected by a responsible and designated adult. (18+ years).
- Children in Years 3 and 4: Are released onto the playground to be met by their adult waiting in their designated area. If you are late for any reason, please ensure your child knows to stay with the teacher if they cannot see you.
- Children in Years 5 & 6: will be released straight from their classroom to walk home or ride home alone or with friends, unless their parent or carer has previously notified the school in writing that they are to be collected.
- Children in Years 3 - 6 may be collected by a responsible and designated older sibling.

If you would prefer your child **not** to be released to travel home alone, please ensure you notify us **in writing** so we can make the necessary arrangements. Thank you for your continued support of **Westfield Primary School**.


Year 5 Parliament Trip

On Thursday 11th September, Year 5 had the opportunity to visit the Houses of Parliament in London. This supported their learning all about British Values, in particular, Law and Order. First, the children discussed the role of Parliament and the government in the United Kingdom. They then learnt the difference between the House of Commons and the House of Lords which then enabled the children to understand their experience in more depth.

After the introduction, the children took part in a tour and were able to wear special headpieces to hear the tour guide. They visited the House of Lords, the Great Hall and the House of Commons. When the children visited the House of Commons, they saw the Speaker of the House, and many politicians debating about different topics. Year 5 also experienced a real debate in the House of Lords and one particular example, was a debate about how to support young people in achieving their dream careers. The children had an amazing experience and learnt many new things about how laws are created in the United Kingdom.

Shoebbox Appeal

We are very excited to announce that we will be supporting Link to Hope's Shoebbox Appeal again this year. Many of these families do not have running water, heating or electricity. Some live in appalling conditions, often living in just one or two rooms, and life for them is a real struggle to survive.

A shoebbox for a family means that everyone receives a gift. A scarf for the mum, a tape measure for the dad, toys and games for the children as well as stationery and coloured pens. Also, toiletries, toothpaste, shampoo and soap to keep everyone clean and free from the germs that make them ill. And of course, sweets and chocolates for everyone - a family favourite!

We are kindly asking for monetary donations (for example 50p or £1) as well as shoebboxes please. We will then use this money to buy items to fill all of our shoebboxes just as we usually do.

Reminder: Respect for Our Local Community

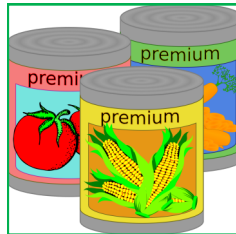


Food Bank Support

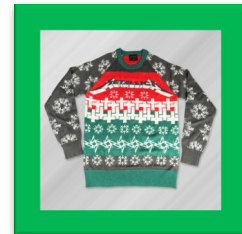

Christmas Jumper Days



We will be holding our Christmas jumper days on the following dress down Fridays; **28th November & 5th December.**

The children may also wear a Christmas Jumper (or Christmas coloured e.g. red or green) over their uniform on **Thursday 18th December**, this is their Christmas meal day.

This is not compulsory and just for fun to celebrate Christmas.

Application for leave of absence/exceptional circumstances

As parents, you have a legal responsibility to ensure your child's attendance at school. Holidays should be taken during the school holiday period. During the academic year pupils are at school for 190 days and at home for 175 days. Students are expected to attend 100% of the time.

Please fill in a request of absence form (available from the office or online) if you want to ask the Headteacher to authorise a *leave of absence* during term time. You must ask well in advance and you are strongly advised to request leave of absence before you confirm your arrangements.

New legislations (Education (Pupil Registration) (England) (Amendment) Regulations 2013) means that if an application is not "*made in advance to the Head teacher by a parent with whom the pupil normally resides, and the Head teacher does not consider that leave of absence should be granted due to the relating to that application*", then it will not be authorised. **We will therefore not authorise any holidays.**

If you take your child out of school without the approval of the school, you may be liable to receive a Penalty Notice from Surrey County Council for failing to ensure your child's regular school attendance.

Holidays in school time will not be authorised. *Guidelines from the local authority are that they may issue a Penalty Notice (with a fine) to each parent, when students are taken out of school during term for 5 days or more and if this absence is recorded as unauthorised by the school (e.g. a holiday). Please note it includes cumulative absence over a 3 month period (several unauthorised absences that total 5 days within a 3 month period).*

The amount payable on issue of a Penalty Notice is £80 per parent per child if paid within 21 days of receipt of the notice, rising to £160 if paid within 28 days. If the penalty notice remains unpaid after 28 days, the Local Authority will consider a prosecution in the Magistrates Court. Please note that penalty notices are issued per parent/carer per child so a family of two parents and two children will receive 4 penalty notices. **If the absence exceeds 20 days, your child's name will be removed from the school roll and you will have to reapply for a place on your return.**

The Headteacher will consider the reasons for the request carefully, taking into account the effect on the continuity of your child's learning and your child's overall attendance rate, and then may authorise up to five days of absence. The Headteacher will notify you, via the office, of the decision within five working days of receiving your written application.

Leave of absence, for exceptional circumstances, will not be granted if additional leave is taken as holiday either side of this time. Proof of flights or other documentation supporting the request must be produced if asked for.

Monthly Attendance Letters

Monthly letters are automatically produced and sent to all parents whose children are late 4 times or more in a month. Monthly letters will also be produced to all parents whose child has an attendance below 90%, and for those between 91-94%. These letters will continue to be sent until the attendance is above 90%. Please be aware that this may take quite a few months.

Surrey Attendance Advice Officer (previously Education Welfare Officer)

The Surrey Attendance Advice Officer monitors the attendance of all children on a regular basis. They may contact parents if children are consistently late or there are concerns about attendance.

SCHOOL PENALTY NOTICE FINES FROM AUGUST 2024



The following changes will come into force for Penalty Notice Fines issued after 19th August 2024

1

FIRST OFFENCE

The first time a Penalty Notice is issued for term time leave or irregular attendance the amount will be:

£160 per parent, per child if paid within 28 days. Reduced to £80 per parent, per child if paid within 21 days.

2

SECOND OFFENCE (WITHIN 3 YEARS)

The second time a Penalty Notice is issued for term time leave or irregular attendance the amount will be:

£160 per parent, per child to be paid within 28 days. No reduced rate will be offered.

3

THIRD OFFENCE AND ANY FURTHER OFFENCES (WITHIN 3 YEARS)

The third time an offence is committed for term time leave or irregular attendance a Penalty Notice will not be issued and the case will be presented straight to the Magistrates' Court. Magistrates'; fines can be up to £2500 per parent, per child. Cases found guilty in Magistrates' Court can show on a Parents future DBS certificate, due to failure to safeguard a child's education.

10 SESSIONS (5 DAYS) OF UNAUTHORISED ABSENCE IN A 10 WEEK PERIOD

Penalty Notice Fines will be considered when there has been 10 sessions of unauthorised absence in a 10-week period.
