Things to make and do


- Create a model dinosaur

Research Ideas

- Find out what dinosaurs liked to eat - get to know the difference between herbivores, carnivores and omnivores!
- Learn about how dinosaurs might have used camouflage to stay safe or to catch their prey
- Who was the first person to find evidence of dinosaurs?
- Where have dinosaur remains been found? (You could mark these on a map of the world!)
- Which dinosaurs lived when? (You could create a timeline to compare when different dinosaurs lived)
