Things to make or do

- ▣ Create your own patterned picture of an exotic fruit bowl, an African landscape etc.
- ▣ Find a simple recipe from Africa or India, ask an adult at home to help you make it. Can you write a recipe for your dish?
- ▣ Find pictures of jungle animals, cut them out and make a book of them, you could add a caption to each one.
- ▣ Write a list of all the wild animals you know, you could use the internet or information books to help you.
- ▣ Make a 3d model of a jungle animal, using different materials.
- ▣ Make some jungle animals or some telescopes and other things to have an exciting adventure in the jungle role play!

Outdoor Ideas

- ▣ Make a den for your garden or outdoor area
- ▣ Create a safari hide/look out in your garden
- ▣ Go for a family walk in your local area and see what wildlife you can see.
- ▣ Grow some fruit plants.
