On Tuesday 10th October it is World Mental Health day and we are celebrating it with YoungMinds' #hello yellow day! We are inviting the children to come to school dressed in items of yellow clothing....they may want to come to school dressed entirely in yellow! It is a mufti day and we would love for the children to try and wear at least one yellow item.

YoungMinds are asking everyone to 'Stand out and Show Up' for children's mental health.

As well as a mufti themed yellow day, we will be carrying out acts of kindness and thinking about their impact and singing and recording a song.

It will be a fun day and most importantly we'll be raising awareness of children's mental health and helping everyone understand that it is 'ok not to be ok' and that there is help available if it is needed.





Reminder:

In school we allow and promote the drinking of water to aid hydration, concentration and overall good health. Children can access their water throughout the day.

It is good to remember that water is the healthiest choice for quenching your thirst at any time. It has no calories and contains no sugars that can damage teeth. If your children don't like the taste of plain water, try adding a slice of lemon or lime to their water bottles. It is worth remembering that sugary drinks can contribute to type 2 diabetes, heart disease and obesity, over time.

Please support your children's good health by ensuring they follow our school rules, polices and procedures. Thank you.

Online Safety

Snapchat features a number of functions to help your child manage who can see their content and how they interact with others. They can also use the reporting function to flag content that breaks community guidelines and upsets them.



Choose who can contact you

If your child is under 18, you can change this setting so that only friends can contact them.

To change this privacy setting:

Step 1 - Go to your profile and tap the gear icon in the top-right corner.

Step 2 - Scroll down to Privacy Control and tap Contact Me. Choose between Everyone and My friends. Tap your chosen option.

Manage chat settings

You can manage chat settings for each friend your child messages. This can limit what kind of contact they have as well as how long messages last or whether your child will receive notifications from the user.


To manage chat settings:

Step 1 – Go to the user's profile. This can be done by going to the chat and

tapping on the user's profile image.

Step 2 - Tap the 2 horizontal dots in the top right corner. Select Chat Settings. Step 3 - Toggle on/off each option you'd

like to manage.




Zones of Regulation

We are very excited to be launching Zones of Regulations to our children this term. Zones of Regulation is a framework to help children identify, regulate and manage their emotions.

The Zones of Regulation use four colours to help children self-identify how they're feeling and categorise it based on colour.

The children are taught about the four colours, and supported in many different ways on how to name their feelings, identify their triggers and develop coping strategies and problem-solving skills.

Each day starts for your child by them identifying their emotional 'colour' which they are able to adjust throughout the day in response to how they are feeling.



In each class, and in other areas around the school, Zones of Regulation Stations have been set up to enable children to regulate their emotions through easy access to the resources.

Dear Parent/Carer,

Westfield Primary school has taken the opportunity to partner with Surrey Police to participate in the Operation Encompass scheme.

Operation Encompass is designed to provide early reporting on any domestic incidents that occur outside of school that may impact on a child's wellbeing and access to learning in school.

The scheme requires the police to report to the school's Designated Safeguarding Lead (DSL) after a domestic incident. The DSL is fully aware of the sensitivity and confidentiality of such information and will handle this information responsibly in accordance with our internal information sharing protocol to ensure that children receive the care and support they may need during the school day.

This scheme enhances our school commitment to ensure every child succeeds by providing timely and high quality pastoral care that improves the wellbeing and safety of all our children.

Open Evening


Our open evening is taking place on Thursday 9th November 5-6.30pm.

Shoebox Appeal

Also toiletries, toothpaste, shampoo and soap to keep everyone clean and free from the germs that make them ill. And of course sweets and chocolates for everyone - a family favourite!

We are kindly asking for monetary donations (for example 50p or £1), as well as **empty** shoeboxes and seasonal wrapping paper please. We will then use this money to buy items to fill all of our shoeboxes just as we usually do.

Restart a Heart Day



On Monday 16th October our Y5 & Y6 will be joining an online interactive CPR awareness session hosted by a paramedic team from Air Ambulance Charity Kent Surrey Sussex (KSS) to mark 'Restart a Heart Day'. The light touch session has been carefully planned and is designed to be both fun and informative and focuses on who to call in an emergency, knowing your address etc., with an CPR interactive demonstration for pupils to follow.

We're asking that the children bring in a cuddly toy as their patient on that day and more information will follow shortly from the class teachers.

Should parents wish to join in the learning, Air Ambulance Charity Kent Surrey Sussex (KSS) are also offering parent and child 30-minute sessions later in the day at 4pm, 5pm or 6pm - to register visit aakss.org.uk/restart.

Again this session is on CPR Awareness and no kit is needed - just have a cuddly toy or pillow to hand for the interactive demonstration.

Absence for Children

If you consider that there are exceptional circumstances relating to your request, please let the school have full details. Each application for a leave of absence will be considered on a case by case basis.

Penalty Notices to Address Poor Attendance at School

A Penalty Notice may be issued as an alternative to the prosecution of a parent/carer for their child's unauthorised absence from school (absence without the agreement of the school or not covered by a medical note) and will be used by Surrey County Council in the following circumstances:-

- 1. Pupils identified by police and Inclusion Officers (formerly Education Welfare Officers) engaged on Truancy Patrols and who have incurred unauthorised absences.
- 2. Leave of absence in term time (5 days or 10 sessions or more).
- Please be aware that The Education (Pupil Registration)(England)(Amendment) Regulations 2013, which became law on 01 September 2013 state that Headteachers may not grant any leave of absence during term time unless there are exceptional circumstances.
- The Headteacher is also required to determine the number of school days a child can be away from school if leave is granted.
- In such cases the Headteacher/Governing Body must decide whether there are exceptional
 circumstances. They may request that the Local Authority issue Penalty Notices when the absence is not
 authorised.

Warnings will not be given where it can be shown that parents have been notified that such absences will not be authorised.

3. Finally, the issuing of a Penalty Notice will also be considered where it is judged that a parent is failing to ensure their child's regular school attendance.

This will be considered when a pupil has incurred 7 or more unauthorised sessions in the previous 6 school weeks, which may include a pupil arriving late after close of registration.

If you believe at any stage that your child's absence from school may leave you liable to receive a Penalty Notice, it is extremely important that you act without delay to secure their regular attendance.

If you have any questions or require further support to achieve an improvement in your child's attendance, please contact your child's school or the Inclusion Officer.

Penalty Notice relating to Exclusions

If a child is excluded from school, Section 103 of the Education and Inspections Act 2006 places a duty on parents/carers to ensure that their child is not in a public place without justifiable cause during school hours.

This duty applies to the *first five days of each exclusion*. Failure to do so will render the parent/carer liable to a Penalty Notice. (Alternative education provision will be made available from the sixth day of any exclusion.)

Amount Payable for a Penalty Notice

The amount payable for a Penalty Notice issued in any of the above circumstances is currently £60 if paid within 21 days of receipt of the Notice, rising to £120 if paid after 21 days but within 28 days.

If the Penalty Notice is not paid, the local Authority must consider a prosecution in the Magistrates Court for the offence for which the Notice was originally issued.

Please be aware that <u>each</u> parent is liable to receive a Penalty Notice for <u>each</u> child who incurs unauthorised absences, for example, if there are two parents and one child, each parent will receive one Penalty Notice.

If there are two parents, and two children incur unauthorised absences, each parent will receive two Penalty Notices, which in this case would amount to £120 each if paid within 21 days.

Surrey County Council is not responsible for authorising pupil absence and therefore cannot withdraw any Penalty Notice requests without the written permission of the Headteacher.
