Westfield School Aim

We want all Westfield children to foster a 'Love of Learning and Love of Life' enabling them to excel, be the best they can and achieve the necessary life skills for the future. Sports Premium purpose: Schools must use the funding to make **additional and sustainable** improvements to the quality of PE and sport they offer.
